

Principal Fishery: White perch, chain pickerel.

Little Rocky Pond is a warm, relatively shallow water with an oxygen deficiency below 15 feet in the summer. It is a little known and lightly fished pond that is mostly used by the few camp owners residing on its shores. The most frequent fish caught here are small white perch and chain pickerel. Stocking is not recommend here because of the competing species and poor summer water quality.

Access here is via a camp road off Route 1A in Ellsworth. Anglers can also access the pond by walking the old railroad bed that runs along its east shore.
