Beaver Pond is located west of the West Arm of the Richardson Lakes. Its main inlet and outlet, Beaver Brook, flows from west to east through the pond. The pond's shoreline is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality in Beaver Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. A naturally reproducing population of brook trout maintains the fishery. Trout growth is fair despite competition from other fish species. The pond is not stocked.

Beaver Pond is accessible via logging roads south of Route 16 or by a foot path leading from nearby Little Beaver Pond. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer months and closed to fishing in the winter. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
