The Billings Ponds are located east of Ledge Ridge. Billings Pond #2 is the northernmost of the group. The pond has no major inlets, but an outlet flows east into the Magalloway River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.


Although Billings Pond #2 is shallow, water temperatures and oxygen levels are suitable for the native brook trout population. Trout growth is poor with heavy competition from other fish species. The pond is not stocked.

Billings Pond #2 is inaccessible to the general public due to private gated roads. The pond is open under general law in the summer and closed to icefishing.
