Big Concord Pond is well suited for warmwater fisheries management. Recent netting and scuba surveys showed excellent smallmouth bass, chain pickerel and white perch populations present. Although white perch are highly prolific and can seriously compete with the bass, the large numbers of these young perch also provide an excellent forage base for smallmouth bass and chain pickerel.

Experimental stocking of large fall fingerling brook trout has recently been initiated to provide a limited winter fishery for brook trout which is generally lacking in this region.
