North Pond, located north of Norway village, is ideally suited for warmwater fisheries management. A small dam on the outlet maintains a constant water level and impounds several acres of wetlands. This pond is very productive, partly due to the shallow average depth. Largemouth bass and white perch exhibit excellent growth rates.

A small dirt boat ramp located adjacent to the outlet is adequate for launching small boats or canoes. Anglers must then negotiate the shallow channel through the wetlands to reach the main portion of the pond.
