
The main basin of Scraggly Lake contains ideal water for coldwater game fish. The small, deep basin in the west arm is deficient in dissolved oxygen below 25 feet during the late summer months. An abundance of competing warmfish species are present.

Tributary spawning facilities for salmon and brook trout are limited. Gravel areas along the lake shores are considered adequate for lake trout to maintain themselves without stocking.

Experimental salmon stocking was started in 1964 to supplement the brook trout and lake trout fisheries. The salmon fishery is dependent upon annual stocking. Smelts were established in 1966 to provide food for the coldwater game fish.
