### Physical Characteristics

Area - 45 acres

#### Temperatures

Surface - 69° F.

Maximum depth - 8 feet

8 feet - 66° F.

Little Pillsbury Pond is relatively shallow with nearly equal water temperatures at all depths. Water temperatures become quite high during hot weather, and trout seek the cooling influence of springs.


Suckers and minnows are abundant, and reduce trout production by competing for available food and space.

Since there are no tributaries suitable for trout spawning, the trout population is maintained by natural reproduction within the pond.

The pond is currently accessible over a gravel road that leads to a pulpwood camp on the shore of the pond.


