

Lost Pond is located north of Rowe Pond. Two small inlets enter the west and south sides and its outlet flows north into the upper section of Wyman Lake. The pond's shoreline is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality in Lost Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. However, spawning and nursery habitats are lacking, so the pond must be stocked annually with brook trout to maintain a fishery. Trout growth is good with only light competition from minnow species.

Lost Pond is accessible via a gravel road off the Rowe Pond Road. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed to winter fishing.
