Tomah Lake is a scenic, remote lake located in the upper reaches of the St. Croix drainage.

The lake was reclaimed in 1965 to remove competing species and make the lake a suitable one for a brood stock water. Brook trout are now being reared in Tomah Lake to provide a source of eggs for hatchery-reared trout hopefully superior to those stocked in the past in Maine waters. Fish are stripped each fall to secure eggs.


Tomah Lake is closed to all fishing.
