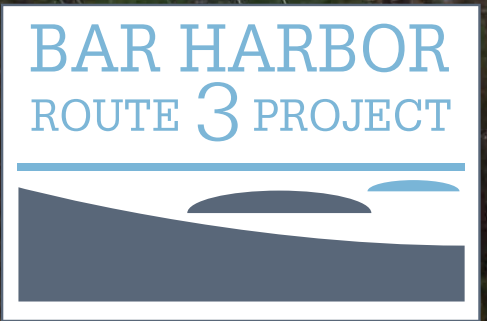


Thank you.

The second year of the reconstruction of Route 3 in Bar Harbor is now complete. MaineDOT and its team of contractors want to send out a big “thank you” to residents, businesses and visitors.

Thank you for your patience, for using the one-way loop detour, and for driving safely through work zones. Here's what we have all accomplished so far:

- Large sections of water lines replaced.
- Replacement of drainage systems and structures.
- New, wider paved shoulders and new pavement on Route 3.
- New ADA-compliant paved sidewalks.
- New ten-foot-wide paved multiuse path, from the Ferry Terminal to the West Street intersection.
- Granite curbing for sidewalks and the multiuse path.
- New guardrail at Ocean Avenue, the Bluffs, and Duck Brook.
- Placed crushed rock all along the Bluffs in the “rock catchment area.”
- Loamed and seeded a large portion of the project (More to be done in the spring).
- Placed a large portion of the new signs that will replace existing roadway signage.

The final phase will begin in March and the entire project should be completed by July 2019. The reconstruction of Route 3 will result in an improved roadway, paved shoulders for bicyclists and

pedestrians, new sidewalks, and many important upgrades for residents and visitors alike. So, thank you for doing your part in making this a safe and successful project in 2018!
