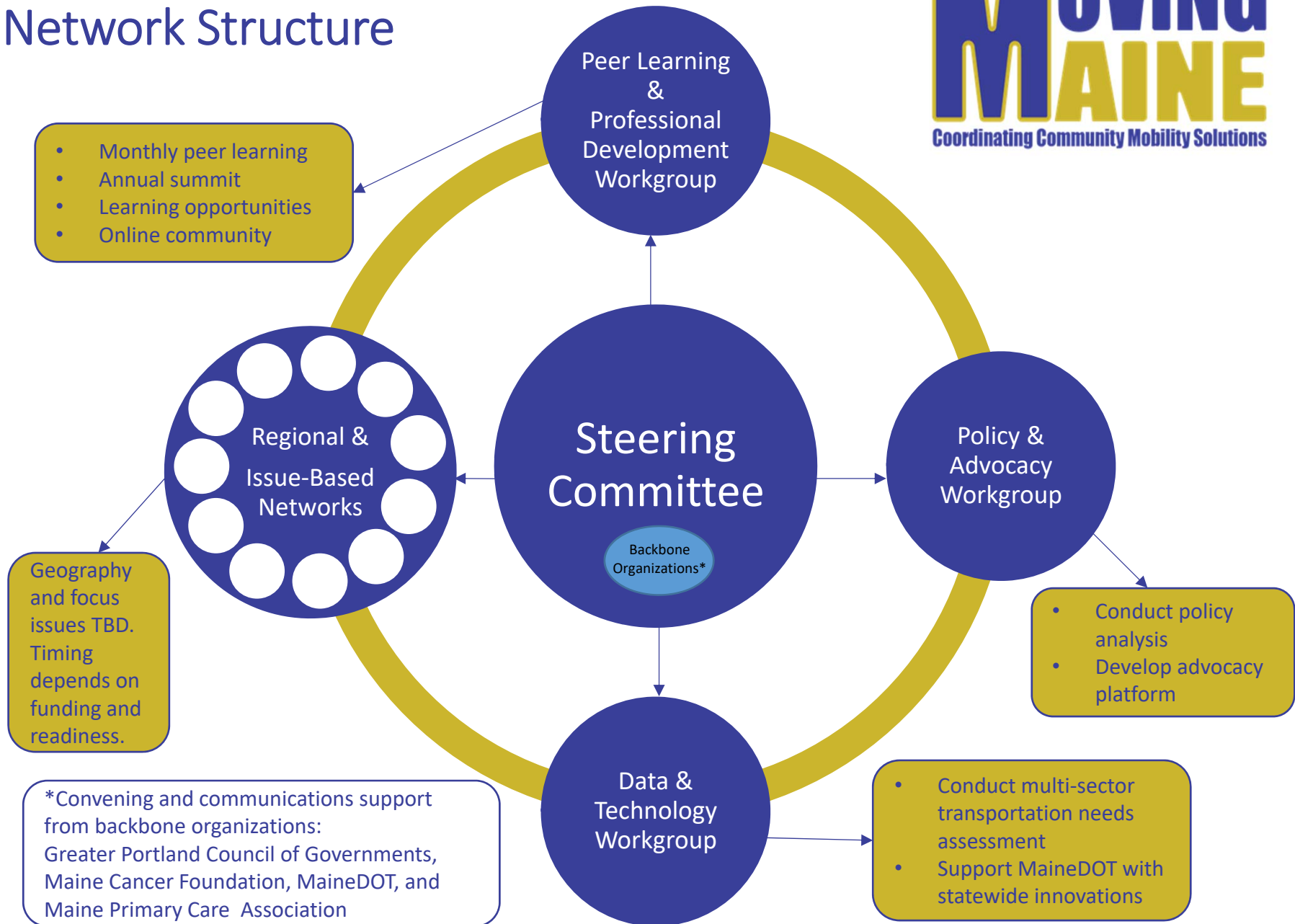

# Moving Maine Mobility Management Network

The Moving Maine Network is a developing group of individuals and organizations from a range of sectors, focused on improving mobility for people who face transportation barriers. The Network will grow as resources, energy, and capacity allows. Network goals include:

- Supporting peer learning and professional development – including through an annual statewide meeting of partners.
- Facilitating the development of regional mobility management groups to ensure that all regions have the local resources needed to solve mobility challenges.
- Convening stakeholders to spur innovation, support adoption of new technology, and to advocate for funding and policy changes.

## What is Mobility Management?

Mobility Management facilitates delivering the transportation options that best meet the community's needs. This growing practice emphasizes coordination among all the key transportation players including not only public transit providers, private operators, and volunteer driver programs but also customers, planners, and stakeholders from human services and health care. Mobility management emphasizes the coordination of transportation services for people with disabilities, older adults, and others with barriers to transportation access, though mobility management approaches benefit all users of the transportation system. In short, mobility management is focused on integration of:

- Individuals into their communities through inclusive planning and more flexible mobility options.
- Different transportation modes to create a seamless journey.
- Technology into transportation to improve its efficiency and effectiveness.
- Transportation into other community services, such as housing, healthcare and employment.
