

**LEAD POISONING EXCLUSION
MAINE**

Under SECTION II – Exclusions, item 2.
COVERAGE E - Personal Liability, the
following exclusion is added:

“Bodily injury” to a person, caused by an
“occurrence” of lead poisoning, starting:

- (1) 31 days or more after either the State of
Maine Department of Human Services or a
lead inspector licensed by that department
has given notice of the existence of an
environmental lead hazard to either an
insured or any person authorized to enter
into a residential rental agreement on behalf
of an **“insured”** and ordered that the
lead-based substances at the insured
location be removed, replaced or securely
and permanently covered within 30 days of
receipt of the notice; or

- (2) Upon expiration of an extension of that
order granted either by the Department of
Human Services or a lead inspector licensed
by that department.

This exclusion does not apply to **“bodily
injury”** that starts after the Department of
Human Services states that the environmental
lead hazard described in the notice no longer
exists.
