

RECIPROCITY

Master Electrician - The Electricians' Examining Board shall issue a license to any person who files a sworn application, who has passed a written examination from the state in which they plan on reciprocating from, and is licensed by another state or territory of the United States that has a reciprocity agreement with the State of Maine, and who has been licensed and actively engaged in work as an electrician for a minimum of six years. The State of Maine presently has reciprocity agreements with New Hampshire and Vermont. Proof of active work as an electrician includes completion and submission of the Board's Work Experience Affidavit (found on our website under "Applications & Forms").

Journeyman Electrician - The Electricians' Examining Board shall issue a license to any person who files a sworn application, who has passed a written examination from the state in which they plan on reciprocating from, and is licensed by another state or territory of the United States that has a reciprocity agreement with the State of Maine, and who has been licensed and actively engaged in work as an electrician for a minimum of four years. The State of Maine presently has reciprocity agreements with New Hampshire, Vermont, North Dakota, Idaho, Oregon and Wyoming. Proof of active work as an electrician includes completion and submission of the Board's Work Experience Affidavit (found on our website under "Applications & Forms").
