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## 2022 Maine Tax Law Changes

The summary includes General Administrative changes as well as provisions for Income Tax, Franchise Tax, Income Tax Withholding, Pass-through Entity Withholding, Insurance Premiums Tax, Sales, Use and Special Taxes, and Property Tax.

# Law Change – Maine Income Tax Withholding on Gambling Winnings Effective August 8, 2022

On April 18, 2022, LD 1917, PL2021, c. 630 was signed into law, setting the Maine withholding rate for certain gambling winnings at the highest marginal tax rate under 36 M.R.S. § 5111. See Sec. A-4. The new rate is applicable to the year during which the winnings are paid, plus any other tax applicable to the winnings under 36 M.R.S., Part 8 (Income Taxes).

Under the new law, the Maine income tax withholding rate on gambling winnings that constitute taxable income paid on or after August 8, 2022 is 7.15%.
